INVITE a friend

Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, was one of the two who heard what John had said and who had followed Jesus. The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, "We have found the Messiah" (that is, the Christ). And he brought him to Jesus. *John 1:40-42*

The next day Jesus decided to leave for Galilee. Finding Philip, he said to him, "Follow me." ...Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph. "Come and see," said Philip. *John 1:43-46*

Four Questions Asked of all Persons Uniting in Membership with CPC:

- 1. Do you acknowledge yourself to be a sinner in need of God's forgiveness and salvation?
- 2. Do you believe in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and trust Him alone to be your Lord and Savior?
- 3. Do you commit to living as a disciple of Jesus Christ, sharing the gospel and serving God's mission in the world, by the gracious help of the Holy Spirit?
- 4. Do you support the vision, values and leadership of CPC, and will you give your time, talent, and treasure to Christ in His Church?

In Essentials...Unity In Non-Essentials...Liberty In All Things...Charity

All Scripture is self-attesting and being Truth, requires our unreserved submission in all areas of life. The infallible Word of God, the 66 books of the Old and New Testaments, is a complete and unified witness to God's redemptive acts culminating in the incarnation of the Living Word, the Lord Jesus Christ. The Bible, uniquely and fully inspired by the Holy Spirit, is the supreme and final authority on all matters on which it speaks. On this sure foundation we affirm these Essentials:

- 1. We believe in one God, the sovereign Creator and Sustainer of all things, infinitely perfect and eternally existing in three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. To Him be all honor, glory and praise forever!
- 2. Jesus Christ, the living Word, became flesh through His miraculous conception by the Holy Spirit and His virgin birth. He who is true God became true man united in one Person forever. He died on the cross a sacrifice for our sins according to the Scriptures. On the third day He arose bodily from the dead, ascended into heaven, where, at the right hand of the Majesty on High, He now is our High Priest and Mediator.
- 3. The Holy Spirit has come to glorify Christ and to apply the saving work of Christ to our hearts. He convicts us of sin and draws us to the Savior. Indwelling our hearts, He gives new life to us, empowers and imparts gifts to us for service. He instructs and guides us into all truth, and seals us for the day of redemption.
- 4. Being estranged from God and condemned by our sinfulness, our salvation is wholly dependent upon the work of God's free grace. God credits His righteousness to those who put their faith in Christ alone for their salvation, thereby justifies them in His sight. Only such as are born of the Holy Spirit and receive Jesus Christ become children of God and heirs of eternal life.
- 5. The true Church is composed of all persons who through saving faith in Jesus Christ and the sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit are united together in the body of Christ. The Church finds her visible, yet imperfect, expression in local congregations where the Word of God is preached in its purity and the sacraments are administered in their integrity; where scriptural discipline is practiced, and where loving fellowship is maintained. For her perfecting, she awaits the return of her Lord.
- 6. Jesus Christ will come again to the earth—personally, visibly, and bodily—to judge the living and the dead, and to consummate history and the eternal plan of God. "Even so, come, Lord Jesus" (Revelation 22:20).
- 7. The Lord Jesus Christ commands all believers to proclaim the Gospel throughout the world and to make disciples of all nations. Obedience to the Great Commission requires total commitment to "Him who loved us and gave Himself for us." He calls us to a life of self-denying love and service. "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them" (Ephesians 2:10).

These Essentials are set forth in greater detail in the Westminster Confession of Faith.



There are two sacraments initiated by Jesus' actions and given to us by His instruction. They are signs and seals of the covenant of grace, representing Christ and what He has done for us, confirming our relationship to Him and marking for us the difference Christ has made in our lives.

BAPTISM

- water (sprinkling or immersions)
- celebrated once
- marks our inclusion into Christ and our new life in Him
- celebrate both infant and adult baptism

THE LORD'S SUPPER/COMMUNION

- bread and cup
- celebrated continually
- affirms our ongoing connection to and dependency on Christ
- open to all who profess faith in Jesus Christ

BAPTISM // REAFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM // DEDICATION

Baptism: A person becomes an active member of our church through faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and acceptance of His Lordship in all of life. Baptism and a public profession of faith in Jesus as Lord are visible signs of entrance into the active membership of our church.

<u>Baptism is received only once</u>. If you were baptized as an infant or child you do not need to do so again. If you have never been baptized, you have the choice of being baptized by sprinkling of water or immersion. Baptism is celebrated during one of our worship services. Baptism in the Presbyterian Church is a Sacrament that involves public vows to follow Christ, followed by the congregation supporting those vows in every way.

Reaffirmation of Baptism: New members who have been previously baptized are given the opportunity to reaffirm their faith and commitment to follow Christ. You have the choice of reaffirming your baptism by sprinkling of water or immersion.

The Baptism of children witnesses to the truth that God's love claims people before they are able to respond in faith. Those presenting children for Baptism shall promise to provide nurture and guidance within the community of faith until the child is ready to make their own profession of faith.

Dedication is a prayer of blessing over a child that expresses the hope that one day each child will come to their own personal decision to follow Christ.
